In the summer of 2007, I was contacted by Andy White from Crossroads Missions, based in Louisville Kentucky. Andy presented me with a proposal to supply Knoxville Habitat for Humanity with two "free" houses. Of course I was initially skeptical. But after excellent communication and cooperation with Crossroads, we entered into an agreement and were gifted with two houses constructed in 8' X 8' panels. All exterior panels were covered with OSB and were very well-constructed. The panels were numbered as to assembly order and a detailed set of drawings was provided, including electrical and structural. There was also a generous stipend for additional costs incurred in the construction of the house. In our case, a large group of Christian young people gathered in the foothills of the Smokies and assembled the panels. The encouragement was apparent with the loving notes written on the framing by the students. Our house went together smoothly and fit exactly on the foundation that was specified with the drawings. I look forward to working with Crossroads again in the near future as we join in assisting deserving families in obtaining a home.
