We are a small community center located in eastern Kentucky, with limited staff and resources, trying to impact our community for the good. We believe that one of the greatest ways we can impact a life is by investing time & energy in people, and give them opportunities to get more out of life.

About a year ago, we were approached by Crossroads Missions in their search to find a place to host work groups. Crossroads Missions made it clear that they were not here to simply use our space, but to partner with us and enable us to do far more. And they have!

The help started last spring, when they gathered donations and renovated the cafeteria kitchen. This in turn has enabled us to efficiently host numerous community meals and mission work groups.

Last summer, CrossRoads Missions provided the volunteer man power for 8 weeks of summer camps. The camps gave students from around the area an opportunity to build confidence in who they are, challenge them in choices they are making, have a good lunch, go to water parks, build relationships with quality CrossRoads' staff (many of whom plan to return this summer), and more. These Crossroads work groups have also performed numerous home repairs and joined with other local organizations to help build new homes for those who really needed it. CrossRoads even provided the walls to these homes!

CrossRoads has also connected the Maytown Center with other organizations to have helped us in our mission. For example, when we needed a van to help with our after-school program, CrossRoads connected us with a church that collected the majority of the money needed to buy the van.

There are plans, with CrossRoads, for more mission groups, more summer camps, re-opening the dilapidated theater, even assisting us in getting working heat in our main building. Most of which we could never accomplish on our own. We are grateful for the partnership with Crossroads and their part they have played in helping us impact the people of eastern Kentucky for the good.
